

Commitment

C&K is committed to providing safe and healthy learning environments for children. Safe, protective and healthy environments are fundamental to every child having the opportunity to learn and grow to their full potential. C&K acknowledges that protecting children's health, safety and wellbeing is everyone's responsibility. Children's health, safety and wellbeing is integral to all decision-making and embedded in organisational leadership, governance and culture.

Responsibilities

C&K will:

- Implement procedures to effectively manage incidents and emergencies that are regularly rehearsed and reviewed.
- Undertake onsite centre/site visits to monitor and provide appropriate direction to employees relating to children's health and safety.
- Work collaboratively with statutory authorities and family support agencies
- When required, seek advice from recognised child health and safety bodies/organisations.
- Regularly review this policy, C&K child health and safety procedures and support resources to ensure they reflect current legislative requirements and best practice guidelines.
- Implement monitoring processes and maintenance schedules to maintain centre buildings, playgrounds and equipment.
- Ensure playgrounds and equipment are fit for purpose and when applicable, meet Australian Safety Standards.
- Facilitate professional development opportunities to support employee understanding of children's health and safety.

Employees will:

- Meet their professional, legal and ethical obligations to protect children as outlined in this policy, <u>Code of Conduct</u> and <u>Child Protection Policy</u>.
- Maintain a 'positive current working with children' check and other licences and qualifications for their position.
- Undergo a National Police Criminal Check upon recruitment or when required by C&K.
- Access relevant C&K information and participate in professional development opportunities to maintain and broaden knowledge of children's health and safety.
- Consistently comply with Education and Care Services National Law and Regulations.
- Promptly raise and escalate health and safety concerns to their centre Director/Manager/Committee.
- Work collaboratively with families to support children's health and safety.
- Support and monitor co-worker understanding of and ability to implement C&K health and safety procedures.

Teachers and educators will:

- Ensure children's health, safety and wellbeing is integral to all centre decision-making and embedded in centre leadership, governance and team culture.
- Identify, analyse, document and manage hazards and implement effective risk mitigating strategies.
- Complete scheduled indoor and outdoor safety checks as outlined in the C&K procedures.
- Promptly complete maintenance requests as required.
- Immediately report and document child incidents as outlined in *Child Centre Incident Reporting Procedure Branch/Affiliate.*
- Undertake incident reviews when significant child health and safety incidents occur and when requested by C&K/ Committee management. As required, implement changes and initiatives to improve child health and safety.
- Only release children to custodial parents/guardians and authorised persons.
- Appropriately induct all educators, centre visitors, students and volunteers to ensure their knowledge of C&K child health and safety procedures relevant to their centre visit or role.
- Interact with children in a warm, positive and respectful manner as outlined in the <u>Supporting Relationships and</u> <u>Partnerships Procedure</u>.
- Never implement any form of inappropriate discipline to children as detailed in *Children's Behaviour Procedure*.
- Minimise the transmission of illness through effective hand-hygiene, exclusion of ill children and staff, effective
 environmental cleaning and promotion of immunisation and health programs as outlined in C&K health procedures
 and <u>Staying healthy: Preventing Infectious Diseases in Early Childhood Education and Care Services</u>.
- Administer and store medication as per <u>Administration of Medication Procedure.</u>
- Provide culturally safe and inclusive programs for children.
- Safely support the inclusion of children with medical conditions as per Medical Condition Procedure.
- Implement adequate health, hygiene and safe food practices.





NQS2 Children's Health and Safety Policy Child Health and Safety

- Consistently implement <u>Red Nose Safe Sleeping Practices</u> as outlined in the <u>Child/Infant</u> Safe Sleep and Rest Procedures to provide a safe and responsive sleep/rest environment for individual children.
- Implement daily sun safety strategies as per <u>Cancer Council</u> guidelines as outline in the <u>Sun Safety Procedure</u>.
- Keep dangerous chemicals, materials or equipment inaccessible to children as outlined in C&K procedure including *Button Battery, Chemical Management* and *Cleaning Procedures*.
- Set-up and use children equipment as per product instructions, <u>*Kidsafe*</u> recommendations and <u>*Outdoor Learning*</u> <u>*Environment Safety Procedure*</u>.
- Adequately supervise children at all times as outlined in <u>Supervision Procedure</u> and centre supervision plan.
- Supervise children and activate online controls and safe search settings when children are interacting with online technology as outlined in *Children's* eSafety Procedure <u>Branch/Affiliate</u>
- Regularly practice and evaluate centre emergency protocols as per *Emergency Management Procedure*.
- Implement risk mitigating strategies as outlined in C&K procedures for excursions and when children travel on regular transport. Always Look Before You Lock.
- Listen and support children to ask for help, speak up, share their concerns, and make complaints when they are unhappy, feel unsafe or disrespected. Children have the right to share their feedback, concerns and complaints on issues that affect them. Listen, take children seriously and respond in a sensitive and timely manner.
- Support and encourage children to share their concerns and involve them in decisions regarding their health, safety, and wellbeing. Seek and consider children's ideas to improve centre safety.
- Support children's understanding of their (and other's) health and safety by regularly incorporating concepts into the curriculum.
- Regularly provide families with relevant child health and safety information and support them in their parenting role.
